#### 127<sup>(22)</sup> Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP) Review

#### 129<sup>(22)</sup> Recreation Ground

Cllr K Assinder asked if the Maintenance Officer (MO) could weedkill the car park at the Rec and fix a broken fence rail – Cllr I Kirkpatrick is to liaise with NW to arrange. KA further reported on the recent Anti Social Behaviour where someone lifted one of the wooden posts out of the ground so that they could drive onto the grass, causing some damage – the post has now been replaced. He has also had an initial meeting with a resident on the play area improvements.

Cllr Hines gave a brief update and details on the broken seat around the oak tree to be repaired by the MO.

Cllr M Johnson reported that the whitebeam logs had now been removed. The Clerk agreed to chase-up A Crotty on the fence and seat works approved at the Memorial Garden.

Cllr M Cox reported on the excellent work carried out by the Pug Brook Working Group both downstream and upstream and that they will be meeting again on 8 October. He has spoken to the landowner at Lye Common and they have agreed to help clear some of their section of the Brook.

Cllr B Kimber reported on the Government's domestic tree seed production initiative to encourage people to plant more native trees.

#### 136<sup>(22)</sup> Wiltshire Council

Cllr H Greenman reported on the revival of the Rural Parishes Forum and the resurrection of the Flytipping Hotspots list and CCTV grants. He further reported on funding from Wiltshire Council for cost of living assistance, more care in the community and homes for vulnerable people and to tackle illicit drug use in the County.
